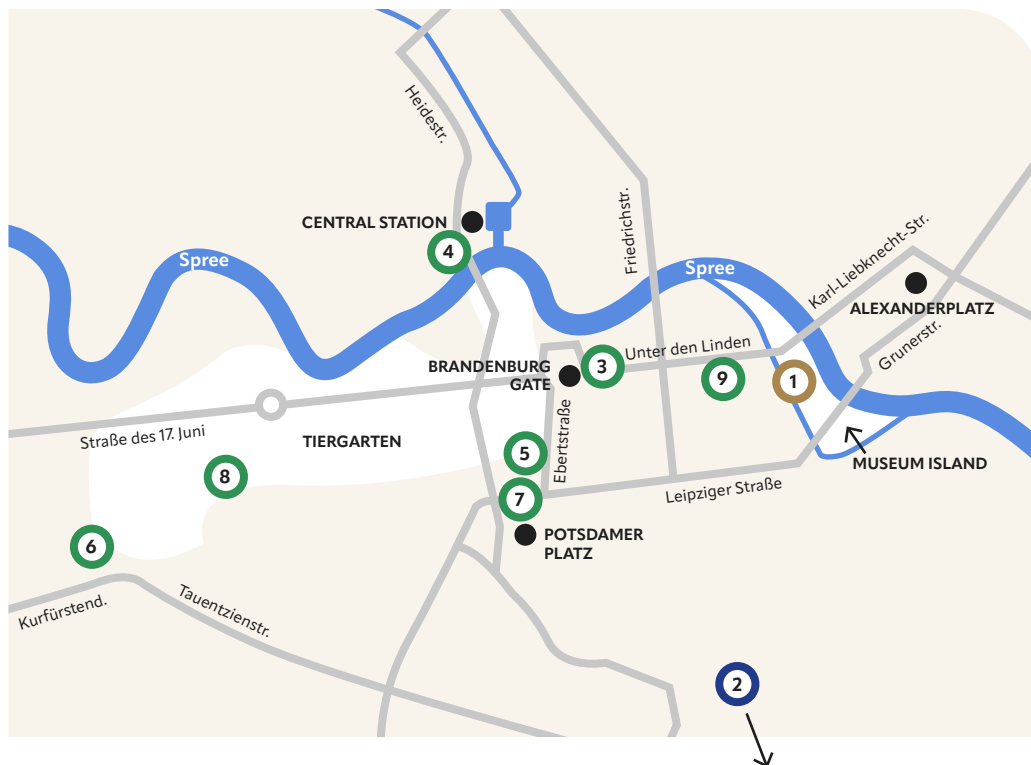

General information

Visa requirements

EU nationals do not require a visa to enter the Federal Republic of Germany. Non-EU nationals do not require a visa if the European Community has abolished the visa requirement for these countries. Taxi

For convenience, or in order to save time, taxis are a good option for getting around. All taxis can be called from the street or ordered via phone or app. 'Unregistered' taxi companies are not an issue in Berlin, and taking a taxi is generally safe. Rush hours should be taken into account when allowing enough time for your journey. The fees are fixed, and the fare depends on the distance travelled.

The estimated taxi fare from BER Airport to the city center is around €50, and the journey takes approximately 40 minutes.

Time zone

Germany will be in the time zone UTC +2.

Climate

The climate in Berlin lies between the humid continental climate and the oceanic climate.

The average daily maximum/minimum temperatures for the month of October are 12.0°C (max.) / 6.0°C (min.).

International dialling codes

The country code for Germany is +49. The area code for Berlin is 030.

Electricity supply

The mains voltage for electricity is 230 V and 50 Hz. The standard wall sockets in Germany are Central European sockets (two-pin plugs).

Currency, banking, credit cards and ATMs

The official currency in Germany is the euro.

Denominations of the euro:

Banknotes: 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200 and 500 euro.

Coins: 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50 cent; 1, 2 euro.

Cash machines: ATMs are available throughout the airport and the city, major credit and bank cards are accepted, and instructions are often available in English.

Cash: It can usually be exchanged at currency exchange counters:

BER Airport: Travelex, Terminal 1, arrivals areas, arrivals 1, level E0

Opening hours: Monday–Sunday, 7:00 am – 7:00 pm

Berlin Hauptbahnhof: Reisebank AG, 1st floor, near the access to platform 13/14

Opening hours: Monday–Saturday, 10:00 am – 2:00 pm and 2:30 – 6:00 pm

Safety

Berlin is considered to be a very safe city. Nonetheless, you should still be cautious of pickpockets and scams around the main tourist sights and traffic hubs. Additionally, it is advisable to remain vigilant at night.

Drinking water

Water from the tap is very clean and safe to drink. The same applies to ice cubes in bars and restaurants, ice-cream bought from street vendors, etc.

Medical Services

All participants will be responsible for payment of any medical, surgical, dental, hospital or ambulance services that they might require in Germany and are advised to make appropriate arrangements for insurance coverage.

Pharmacies: "Apotheken" are generally open Monday to Saturday from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm. They are closed on Sundays, but there is always an on-duty pharmacy ("Notapotheke") open 24 hours for medical emergencies. Pharmacies can be identified by a special sign in the window.
